<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: The Muddy Creek Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Mr. Kerr at 7:01 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ROLL CALL: Those present included Mr. Dale Kerr, Mr. Rick Saunders, Mr. Sean Gramz, Mrs. Kelly Livermore, and Mr. Thomas Smith.

NOTICE OF RECORDING POLICY: Mr. Kerr requested for anyone in the meeting to acknowledge the use of a recording device. Mr. Gramz acknowledged a recording device.

<u>VISITORS:</u> Pat Moore, Bob Badger, Audrey Badger, Megan Duncan, Doug Symoniuk, Jim Shade, John Conrad, Larry Coble, Vicki Saunders, Kirk Brethauer, Carol Brethauer, George Watterson

TREASURER'S REPORT/FINANCIAL STATEMENT: Motion made by Mr. Saunders to approve pay the bills. Second by Mr. Kerr. All in Favor. Motion Carried.

MINUTES: The June 22, 2009 meeting minutes were presented. Motion by Mr. Saunders to approve, second Mr. Kerr. All in favor. Motion carried.

CORRESPONDENCE:

- A. Debra Allen: Discussed the status of her property.
- B. Penn Christian School: Requests to have the speed limit in front of the school lowered. Dale will check with Dick Knapko to find out who would pay for a traffic study.
- C. Butler County Association of Township Officials Minutes were distributed to the Supervisors.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Prior to public comment, Mr. Saunders provided a synopsis of the current legal proceeding against the former secretary/treasurer, Mrs. Dixie Christy. Mr. Saunders stated that in October of 2008, the township auditors called and claimed to have found discrepancies in the payroll account. Mr. Kerr and Mr. Saunders spoke with Vivian Caruso, CPA who informed them that checks were being made payable to Mrs. Christy that were not "due". When Mrs. Christy was confronted about the allegations, Mrs. Christy resigned without notice. Following more investigation, discrepancies where also noted from 2005-2008. The investigation was then turned over to the Pennsylvania State Police who investigated and filed charges. Mr. Saunders stated that "it won't happen again." There have been changes made to prevent it from happening again. Some of the changes include contracting with ADP for processing of the payroll. The previously used software system was discontinued and new accounting software was installed.

A request was made to identify who is responsible for the watch children sign on Burnside Road. In addition, the township was requested to plow a private road off of Burnside Road. The township does not plow private roads.

PLANNING COMMISSION REPORT:

No report. The next meeting will be held on July 16, 2009.

ROAD DEPARTMENT REPORT:

Mr. Kerr reported that the Ford 550 has been broken down which causes the summer work plan to be adjusted.

Mr. Gramz stated that the brush was high on West Park Road (from Burnside Road turning left).

- F. <u>UCC Appeals Board:</u> The Borough of Portersville has declined to develop a joint UCC appeals board. Mr. Kerr will make an inquiry to Lancaster Township about the development of a joint UCC appeals board. Motion to table made by Mr. Saunders, second by Mr. Gramz. All in favor. Motion carried.
- G. UCC Permits: The properties (275 Hufnagel Road, 1583 Perry Highway and Route 19 –Lechner residence) with pools installed without permits have been forwarded to the BCO. The property on Moraine Drive building a deck with no permit has been forwarded to the BCO. The BCO will be contacted to follow up on the alleged structural damage at 147 and 149 Moraine Drive. Motion to table made by Mr. Saunders, second by Mr. Kerr. All in favor. Motion carried.
- H. <u>Administrative Procedures:</u> Mrs. Livermore asked the Board of Supervisors what format they would like the administrative procedures to be developed. The Board will adopt an administrative procedures manual. Motion to table made by Mr. Saunders, second by Mr. Kerr. All in favor. Motion carried.
- I. <u>Traffic Signal Insurance:</u> Mrs. Livermore is have a difficult time obtaining a breakdown of the components of the traffic signals and components. Motion to table made by Mr. Kerr, second by Mr. Saunders. All in favor. Motion carried.

CORRESPONDENCE:

- A. Cocciardi and Associates: Worker's Compensation Site Safety Inspection was distributed to each supervisor for review.
- B. BCATO PSATS has requested for the supervisors to write to local legislators to oppose legislation that would impose a tax or fee for private water sources.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

John Conrad asked about the check register, Fire Tax Fund and Medical and Dental Insurance. Brian Sicilia asked about the alleged theft of township funds. Was there bonding in place and is there a time frame for which to collect from the bonding company.

John Conrad asked about a "better way" to disseminate information to the public.

Brian Sicilia asked about the township's ability to plow private roads. (Private roads are not plowed by the township. Private roads must meet standards in order for the township to consider accepting the transfer of a private road. The cost incurred for any work completed on private roads is the responsibility of the home owners association or property owners)

Chris Mater asked if property owners bring the roads up to specifications and offer to dedicate the road to the township, the township can refuse the dedication. (As it is now, the township cannot accept the road).

Alex Meder asked what the reason for any newly developed road not to be accepted by the township.

Bryan Sicilia commented that they are trying to maintain the road to the best of their ability to take care of their kids. (Mr. Gramz advised them to contact an engineer to determine the specifications and the cost necessary to bring the road up to specifications if necessary. Mr. Gramz also stated he has to abstain from any decisions on the road (Hunter's Hill) because of conflict of interest.

- I. Portersville School Speed Limit: Mr. Kerr checked with Penn Dot who will analyze the need of the speed limit reduction and the township will need to request the reduction. If there is a cost associated with the traffic study, the school should absorb the costs. Mr. Gramz asked who enforced the speed limit. A representative from the school will be invited to attend the next meeting. An inquiry is being made whether the school has insurance on the current illuminated speed limit sign as well as a maintenance agreement.
- J. <u>Diesel Fuel Bid:</u> Motion to table made by Mr. Kerr. Second by Mr. Saunders. All in favor. Motion carried.

K. Holding Tank Ordinance: The draft ordinance provided by Mr. Duncan is specific for existing only and not new construction. The Board of Supervisors have requested for Mr. Smith to review the ordinance as well as develop a maintenance agreement. Mr. Duncan will provide a copy of an existing agreement to Mr. Smith. Mr. Beacom, attorney representing Mr. Scheaffer, commented that Mr. Scheaffer wants to remodel the interior and get an occupancy permit for the exiting building so that he can operate his towing business.
